Inclusive education is a new approach towards educating the children with disability and learning difficulties with that of normal ones within the same roof. It brings all the students together in one class room and one community, regardless of their strength or weaknesses in any area, and seeks to maximize the potentialities of all the students. When we listen and celebrate what is both common and different, we become a wiser, more inclusive and better organization.

eevan Jyoti Higher Secondary Inclusive School started in April, 2011, with a limited number of students, but in its journey of 10 years, it has shown a steady growth and consistent performance.







Following are the brief review of performance of the school –

Enrollments –

- Pre-Primary 121 Students
- Primary 540 Students
- Junior High School 603 Students
- High School 240 Students

Among these, there are <u>42</u> visually impaired pupils, <u>8</u> children with other disabilities, 48 academic staff, 5 office staff and 15 supportive staff currently working in this school.

We started our ONLINE classes on 7th April, 2020, through various digital applications. From the very beginning of the session, we had started our very own E-portal, SMS facilities, etc.

- 5. World Disability Day it is celebrated on 3rd December every year in the school. Villagers from vicinity were invited, following all the proper precautions and social distancing. Food boxes, eatables and woolen blankets were distributed among them. Sr. Shruti, the President of the Congregation was the chief guest of the event









6. Society Day – Father Antonius Bodewig's Birthday is marked as Society Day by the missionaries of Queen of Apostles, every year on 8th December.
