This Annual Report enumerates the labor of love, activities and achievements of the school during the academic year 2019-2020. Our enrolment has an upward trend, reaching nearly 1524 students which is enlisted below -

- Pre-Primary -166 Students.
- Primary 534 Students.
- Junior High School 595 Students.
- High School 229 Students.

Among this number there are 8 catholic, 42 visually impaired pupils, and 16 children with other disabilities (Hearing Impaired-3, Motor disability-5, Learning disability-3, Low Vision-5), 48 academic staff, 5 office staff, and 17 supportive staff currently working here.


24 B.ED students from Tibetian institute were with us for two weeks for their teaching practice in the month of January. They were very much impressed to see the discipline and the


- ❖ World Sight Day It was celebrated on 11th October, 2019 in the Special School ground.
