Jeevan Jyoti Higher Secondary Inclusive School for girls with and without impairment started in year 2011, with the objective of bringing all the students together in the classroom, regardless of their strengths and weaknesses in any area and seeks to develop to the full potential of these students. The aim is to form an inclusive society where all the children should live with dignity and respect.

The school caters 1581 students, among 41 visually impaired 20 students with other disabilities, with 33 sections by 42 teachers, 4 clerical staff and 19 supportive staff.








7. Children's Day/ Sports Day

STAFF MEETINGS –


