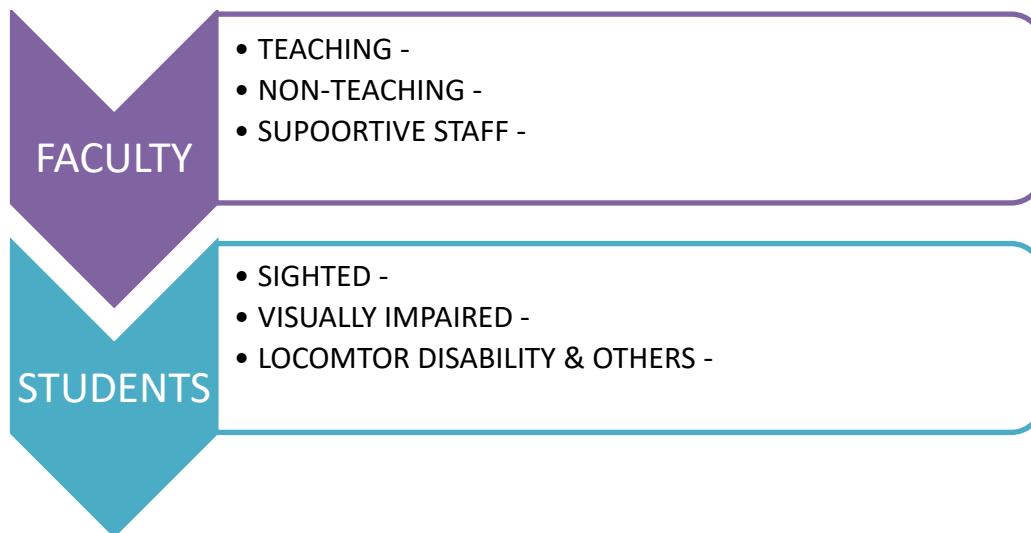

Jeevan Jyoti Higher Secondary School, established in 2011, is a haven for the girl child, where they can dream and achieve, without prejudice. It gives them a sky and air under their wings so that they can soar as high as they want. It includes girls from various walks of life, studying together in a classroom, irrespective of their background. There are more than 1500 students enrolled, including 50 Visually Impaired children, 8 with locomotor disabilities and 20 with other disabilities. Jeevan Jyoti Higher Secondary school is affiliated with Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and it upholds rigorous academic standards; ensuring students receive a well-rounded education.

ACADEMIC TRIUMPH – BOARD RESULTS

There is always a reward for hard work. The students of Jeevan Jyoti Higher Secondary School received cent percent results in Board Exams. The highest percentage scored by the students of class 10th is 95.6 percent and of class 12th is 98.2 percent scored by Ashika Singh in Humanities who stood II in the



district of Varanasi, 94 percent in Maths Stream and 89.8 percent in Biology Stream. The highest marks scored by Visually Impaired children in class 10th is 91.4 percent and in class 12th is 93.8 percent.

In Quiz Competition, Jeevan Jyoti bagged 1st prize in Senior Group, 2nd prize in Junior Group and a special prize was given to the visually impaired students in Senior category. In Kho-Kho, Inclusive School won 2nd prize.



10. Rangotsav Awards, 9th December, 2025 – 89 students were awarded with medals and certificates for their commendable performance in the competition.

11. House wise Carol Singing Competition 20th December, 2025 – Among Junior Group, Green House students won 1st prize and among Senior Group, Yellow House students received 1st position.

12. International Hindi Olympiad – on 13th January, 2026, the students received awards and certificates for participating and qualifying this Olympiad. Among 201 participants, 15 students got gold medals, 13 got silver medals and 12 got bronze medals.

On 22 Feb, Aradhya Yadav of class 6 stood 8th across India and received medal and certificate from the Governor of Ladakh. The Principal, Sr. Monica and Madam Sangeeta were also felicitated for their contribution.

13. Inter School Academic and Creative Competition was conducted on 6th February, 2026 for the students of classes 8, 9 and 11. The competitions were – Quiz, Poster Making and Reel/Short Video Making. It was organized by Fr. Anand IMS, Shauhard Peace Centre.

Teachers consistently strive to take extra classes for the students with disabilities, after school or in the periods allotted to them. Teachers read and explain the chapters, clear their doubts and dictate exercises whenever required.

PARENT TEACHERS' MEETINGS –

In the months of August, November and January, there was an open communication between parents and the teachers regarding the students' performance, progress, weaknesses and several other points during the meeting. Weaker students were especially called along with their parents after every assessment to meet Sr. Monica and create an action plan for them. On 10th October, Half Yearly Report Cards were distributed to all students.

STAFF MEETINGS –

At the end of every month, staff meetings were conducted by Sr. Monica to discuss the teaching process, maintenance of discipline, proper functioning of the school, duties of teachers and students' progress. At the end of the session, annual evaluation of the year was done by the teachers and the principal.

RESULT DAY

The result was distributed on 28th March, 2026. Many of the students excelled with flying colors. It was a successful event.
